## Information being withheld

There are additional documents covered by your request relating to the recruitment process for the appointment of Police Commissioner that I have decided to withhold in full under one or more of the following sections of the OIA, as applicable:

- section 9(2)(a) to protect the privacy of natural persons, including deceased people
- section 9(2)(g)(i) to maintain the effective conduct of public affairs through the free and frank expression of opinions
- section 9(2)(b)(a)(ii) to protect information which is subject to an obligation of confidence or which any person has been or could be compelled to provide under the authority of any enactment, where the making available of the information would be likely otherwise to damage the public interest
- section 9(2)(h) to maintain legal professional privilege

In making my decision, I have considered the public interest considerations in section 9(1) of the OIA.
