Te Pae Turuki | Public Service Leaders Group is made up of chief executive nominated roles, based on <u>criteria</u> set by Te Kawa Mataaho Public Service Commission.

About Te Pae Turuki

"Te Pae Turuki, the Public Service Leaders Group, comprises senior public servants in the most complex and influential leadership roles. Te Pae Turuki has a special job - collectively leading Aotearoa New Zealand's Public Service."

What is Te Pae Turuki | Public Service Leaders Group?

Te Pae Turuki is the Public Service Leaders Group. Formed in 2017, this group works in concert with Te Ohu Tumu Whakarae i te Tūmatanui | Public Service Leadership Team to steward the system together across agency boundaries tackling some of the biggest and most complex issues facing New Zealanders today.

The term 'Te Pae Turuki' can be translated as 'Action Leaders.' Pae refers to orators/leaders or a collective of such people. Turuki is used in the traditional call 'Turuki! Turuki!,' which exhorts a group of people to move as a collective to accomplish large, demanding tasks. The te reo Māori name captures the purpose of this group, which is to work as a team to provide strong, unified leadership across the Public Service. Te Pae Turuki roles position leaders at the nexus of leading within their agency and leading across the system.

There are over 1100 roles in Te Pae Turuki from thirty-eight core Public Service agencies. Across the group 50% of these roles are held by women. The ethnic diversity of Te Pae Turuki continues to evolve as it moves to be more reflective of New Zealand.
