Te Tohu Oranga Angitū Lifetime Achievement Award

The Public Service Commissioner selects the recipient of Te Tohu Oranga Angitū | Lifetime Achievement Award.

Eligibility

Nominees may have served at any level of the Public Service. They must clearly identify as a public servant and have spent the majority of their working life in the Public Service.

Nominees must be a current employee of an agency in one of the following categories:

- Central government departments (including non-public service departments)
- Crown entities, excluding Crown entity subsidiaries, and school boards of trustees
- Public Finance Act Schedule 4A Companies
- Offices of Parliament
- State-owned enterprises, excluding mixed ownership model companies
- Tertiary education institutions in the state sector (universities, polytechnics, wānanga)
- Local government organisations, excluding council-controlled organisations.

Endorsement can be either a signature (below) or a brief email from the chief executive/board chair.

Note that endorsement implies agreement to provide information to Te Kawa Mataaho Public Service Commission, and the use of that information to evaluate this nomination and for publicity purposes.
